WORKSHOP ON ANTICIPATORY COMPLIANCE

DATA PROTECTION NOTICE

In the context of the EDPS Conference, the EDPS team is organising a side event dedicated to the concept of anticipatory enforcement, supported by methodologies from the foresight domain. The final aim is to have a multistakeholder discussion and a scenario exploration on plausible future to feed the general narrative of the Conference. Some personal data will be processed during the exercise and its preparation.

We process your personal data based on <u>Regulation (EU) 2018/1725</u> of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions and bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC (hereinafter 'the Regulation'). We provide you with the information that follows based on Articles 15 and 16 of the Regulation.

Who is the controller?

What personal data do we process and who has access to this personal data?

We process the following personal data: name, email and affiliation including your role in your organisation.

Where did we get your personal data?

These personal data were provided to us when enrolling in the <u>2022 Conference</u> through the application form.

Why do we process your personal data and under what legal basis?

We process your personal data to seek your voluntary participation to our workshop and to select participants in order to reach a good balance between participants affiliations.

The lawfulness of the processing of personal data for the organisation, management and follow up of the Conference is Article 5(1)(a) of the Regulation (*'processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body*'). The applicable legal basis is the Regulation, and in particular those provisions establishing the EDPS and its tasks (Article 57 (b) of the Regulation).

As your participation to the workshop is voluntary, the legal basis for processing your personal data is Article 5(1)(d) of the Regulation (namely, your consent).

How long do we keep your personal data?

We do not keep your personal information for longer than necessary for the purposes for which we collected it. However, we may keep your information for a longer period for statistical purposes with the appropriate safeguards in place (data aggregation).

Your contact details submitted via the registration form will be kept for six months following the conference or at the latest after the last follow-up action.

What are your rights regarding your personal data?

You have the right to access your personal data and to relevant information concerning how we use your personal data. You have the right to request rectification of your personal data. You have the right to ask that we delete your personal data or restrict its use. Where applicable, you have the right to object to our processing of your personal data, on grounds relating to your particular situation. Where applicable, you the right to your data portability. We will consider your request, take a decision, and communicate it to you.
